The Changing Faces of Ministry

At a summer-time 'wine and dessert' which I hosted for our ministry team and spouses in early August I was struck by the number of clergy and licensed/authorized ministers who serve in our parish. At the same time I was pleased by how freely and happily they all engaged with one another—a sign of mature and generous spirits committed to the common life of the Body of Christ.

Hearing about the shrinking of clergy numbers in so many parts of the Church we ought to bear in mind how fortunate we are.

At the same time, there is flux in our ministerial company. We are aware of that today as we bid farewell to Canon Charles and Felicity Masheder. But there is more change afoot still. Our 'local' bishop, **Henry Scriven**, with his wife **Catherine**, who have shared our ministry and life for well over a decade, will be leaving the parish to re-settle in Chipping Norton. Their presence through the years has given us a more global sense of the Church as their very international ministry and travel has enriched and coloured the insights and perspectives they have shared. Fortunately, Bp Henry will carry-on as one of the honorary assistant bishops in our diocese so we probably haven't seen the last of him in his purple pursuits! At time of writing particulars are not wholly clear, but what *is* clear is that we will miss them and that their new community and parochial home will be blessed.

Early in the summer our Parochial Church Council (PCC), with my full endorsement, voted to support the application of warden **Linda Hobbs** to begin training as a Licensed Lay Minister. Linda has shown exemplary service as a parish warden and now, in her final year of service, she transitions from that firm basis of Christian service toward licensed public ministry. Linda's strength and commitment lay in the sphere of pastoral care (as many of us well know) and it is supposed at this early stage that her future LLM ministry at St Helen's and in the parish will concentrate in that sphere. The diocese has changed the content of the LLM training so we await news of what it involves from Linda herself as she gets 'stuck in'. Doubtless in future issues of *TEAMword* we will hear more. Please pray for Linda (and her supportive husband Kelvin) as she begins this exciting new stage in discipleship and ministry.

Permission(s) to Officiate

The Diocese of Oxford now requires that all clergy seeking a PTO meet with the incumbent and complete a *pro forma* detailing the proposed terms of ministry in the parish. The aim is to clarify mutual understandings and to provide a base for annual review. Over the course of the summer I have met with *almost all* of the clergy with PTO to complete the above referenced form. It has been good to have such one-on-one time with colleagues and gratifying to hear of their pleasure in sharing the ministry with those of us who constitute the formal 'Team'. We depend heavily on our free-willing ministerial colleagues to keep the show on the road'. So, 'Thank You!' to you all.

First Communion Preparation

An on-line First Communion course of preparation is being led by Canon Gordon Oliver, a retired priest in the Rochester diocese who is also the father of St Helen's parishioner Jonathon Oliver. Gordon led a successful course two years ago and I appreciate his willingness to lead a larger group again – this group aiming to include children from both St Nicolas and St Helen's. The aim is to celebrate the children's First Communion in October.
