Exploring Spirituality

Spirituality is one of those words that people often use but not always meaning the same thing. For some, spirituality is connected to – and cannot be separated from – religious belief and faith. For others, spirituality is something that transcends religion, or even replaces it. For Christians, spirituality is an aspect of our faith, but even agreeing on that, we might not know exactly what a person means when he or she talks about their own spirituality.

There are, indeed, many ways to define spirituality, but I like to think of it as our awareness of, response to, and movement towards God. Spirituality has different facets and expressions, some of which exist corporately, as in our shared worship. Others are more personal in nature, for example, our personal prayer life and how we live out our faith.

In our autumn Faith Forum series, we'll be exploring some aspects of personal spirituality, both its expression and how we nurture our spiritual life. We'll begin our look at spirituality with a talk by Margaret Adam on prayer. In October, we'll hear about the practice of Lectio Divina and prayerful reading of scripture. We'll finish in November with a look at how we live out our faith in the world.
