Safeguarding

What does the word "Safeguarding" mean to you – unnecessary red tape, box ticking, time consuming training ... Or is it about life giving love, healing and wholeness, building up the body of Christ and living so that Christian values are embedded throughout every day? Policies and procedures are necessary but it's our church culture that matters, the way we do things, the way people are treated. Can we question freely, can we discuss, can we listen? Church Safeguarding matters because -

- Caring and wanting the best for each other is a basic gospel value. Jesus said "I
 have come that you may have life in all its fullness" not just kept safe from harm,
 scraping along but to realise our fullest potential
- Proverbs 31.8 commands us to "Speak out on behalf of the voiceless and for the rights of the vulnerable". The Bible bias is always to the vulnerable. Matthew 18.6 warns us not to cause a "little one" to stumble.
- We need to uphold the good name of the Church. Our church communities must be safe places where everyone can flourish, the vulnerable find protection and the hurt healing. If we can't do that, who can? There has too much bad press which dishonours God. Too many lives have been and are being damaged by abuse of power. We need an open minded attitude of "it could happen here" We need to protect ourselves from false accusations
- The Church is open to all including offenders so there is a balance to be had between welcome and watchfulness.

Safeguarding is for everybody by everybody. Look in a mirror and you will see the person responsible for safeguarding in our parish. Please help by taking training/DBS checks as required for your role and following policies. Thank you to the team, Emmanuel Chukwuma at St Helens, Jenny Fishpool at St Nicolas, Douglas Aitkin at St Michaels, Catherine Kimber for DBS. Thank you for trusting me to be your parish safeguarding officer.
