Dear Friends -

We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song! (St Augustine)

In this season of Eastertide one of the ways we celebrate the resurrection is in our music and with unbounded 'Alleluias'. I want therefore to draw your attention to two things that are coming up and a third which is mentioned elsewhere in this pewleaflet.

The first is this evening when we see the revival of **Taize Prayer** in the parish. For some years before the pandemic there was a monthly service using Taize chants in the context of evening worship at St Helen's. This is being re-launched this evening in St Helen's, at the same time as previously, 5.30pm. I would like to extend a warm welcome to you all. It will be a short service of prayer using scripture, song and silence, followed by refreshments. It will be followed by a short time of discussion to learn more about this contemplative form of prayer using the simple chants for which the Taize Community, in France is well-known. If you know the Taize community, you will be aware that it is set in the beautiful Burgundy countryside of France. To learn more about it there is an article in this month's Candle in the Window which has just been published – please do take a look at that. It can be found on the parish website.

The second is a particular treat for us here at St Michael's when, on next Sunday (21 April), Cothill House Boys' Choir will be joining us to sing the Mass to a setting composed by our organist Graham Howell. Each movement is in a different style but all are influenced by elements of jazz. There are instrumental parts too which will be played by some of the boys. The musical movements are: Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus & Benedictus and Agnus Dei. During communion the choir will sing the motet "Panis Angelicus" by Cesar Franck. The boys from Cothill House will have worked especially hard for this occasion. So please make a special effort to support them with your presence and to welcome their parents and families who will be with us in the congregation.

THE REVD PETER SILVA/ ST KENELM'S CHURCH, ENSTONE The celebration of Fr Peter Silva's 50th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood on Saturday 6 April at St Kenelm's Church was a wonderful, joy-filled occasion. Fr Peter chose John's account of the Wedding at Cana in Galilee as the gospel passage (John 2.1-10) and preached a memorable sermon on transformation, drawing on moving experiences of churches he served both in South Africa and this country. One of these was when as a young priest (long before Apartheid ended) he was asked to celebrate the Maundy Thursday Liturgy at a black township church. He did the foot-washing in the traditional way, ending by kissing the feet of each person. The participants found this deeply moving and afterwards one of them said to him, 'this is the first time a white person has kissed our feet, it is a vision of what South Africa can become'. Transformation. 'Laudete Dominum' for Fr Peter's ministry.

The earliest church on the site of St Kenelm's Church dates from around 850AD. Much of the current building dates back to the 13th, 14th, 15th centuries and recent developments (completed in 2020) include a new mosaic reredos and a very well-thought-out servery. The reredos had a familiar look to it and it turned out that this was designed and constructed by Nicholas Mynheer, a name that will be familiar to a number of our readers. The reredos consists of five panels: The Dream of Kenelm, The Betrayal of Kenelm, The Betrayal of Christ, The Resurrection of Christ and the Resurrection of Kenelm. <u>HEATING</u> During the week 23 March to 30 March (Holy Week), the maximum temperature recorded on the data logger by the pillar by the crossing (North side) was 19.8°C (on Good Friday afternoon) and the minimum 15.2°C (Saturday morning, start of the recording period). During the following week 30 March to 6 April (Easter week), the maximum temperature recorded on the data logger by the pillar by the crossing (North side) was 19.9°C (on Holy Saturday afternoon) and the minimum 14.5°C (during the morning of Thursday 4 April). The heating has now been turned off.

<u>This Week</u> The celebrants and preachers on Sundays over coming weeks are: 14 and 21 April Fr Paul; 28 April The Revd Dr Charles Miller.

There are two commemorations in the calendar this week: Tuesday: Isabella Gilmore, Deaconess, 1923 and Friday, Alphege, archbishop, martyr, 1012.

<u>Isabella Gilmore</u> was the third sister of the designer William Morris. Born in 1842, she left the comfort of a middle-class lifestyle to work with the poor in South London, as a nurse at Guy's Hospital and then as a Deaconess. She played a key role in the revival of the Deaconess Order in the Church of England. She was ordained in 1887 and then ran a training house in Clapham until 1906 during which time she trained head deaconesses for at least seven other dioceses. At her memorial service, Dr Randall Davidson predicted that "some day, those who know best will be able to trace much of the origin and root of the revival of the Deaconess Order to the life, work, example and words of Isabella Gilmore". She died on 16 April in 1923. For more information about Isabella, there is an interesting article of the Rochester Cathedral web site, https://www.rochestercathedral.org/research/gilmore. (Under Bishop Thorold, Isabella took on work in Rochester Diocese.)

<u>Prayers for Israel and Gaza</u> From the Easter Message from the Patriarchs and Heads of the churches in Jerusalem: In issuing this Easter proclamation, we fully recognize the intense suffering that surrounds us here in the Holy Land, as well as in many other parts of the world. Speaking more directly to our own circumstances, we repeat our denunciation of all violent actions in the present devastating war, especially those directed against innocent civilians and we reiterate our call for an immediate and sustained ceasefire. ...

While extending this Easter message to Christians and others around the world, we offer our special greetings to those of the faithful in Gaza who have been bearing especially heavy crosses over the past several months. These include those taking refuge inside St, Porphyrios and Holy Family Churches, as well as the courageous staff and volunteers of the Anglican-run Ahli Hospital, along with the patients they serve.
