### **The Story of Bartimaeus**

In this Sunday's gospel we meet a man who is blind and in the grip of poverty as a result – 'a blind beggar' (Mark 10.46). He is isolated, marginalised, and endures the hostility of those around him because of his impairment. He may be unable to see, but he has a voice which he uses, despite the crowds who seek to silence him. Learning Jesus is on his way: '*...he began to shout out and say, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' (v47)*, Bartimaeus cries out with raw need and bold faith. Jesus does not silence him but asks that Bartimaeus be brought to him. Bartimaeus' loud prayer of anguish is answered. His need is met by Jesus who heals him and restores his sight. I am sure that he cannot only now see, but is healed and restored in every way.

### **Next Sunday 3 November – ALL SAINTS SUNDAY**

A reminder there are no other services in our churches next Sunday other than the Sung Eucharist at St Helen's in the afternoon. This will be held at **3 pm** and will be Charles, our Team Rector's final service, at which he will preside and preach. Please do join us as we give thanks for his long ministry in this parish and bid him Godspeed and every blessing for a long and rich retirement.

### **Moving Forward**

The Archdeacon met with all Churchwardens in the parish, Fr AKMA, the Deanery Lay Chair (Sue Scott), together with myself and the Area Dean (The Revd Rob Glenny, Vicar of Radley, Sunningwell and Kennington), for a pre-vacancy meeting last Monday. He talked through the legal requirements of moving forward during the vacancy including preparing a Parish Profile and the process towards interviews to appoint a new Team Rector. The PCC Standing Committee meets on 11 November to discuss this further and to take things forward. The Archdeacon made clear that there will be no Acting Team Rector *per se*, but that the *authority* for the vacancy lies firmly with the Churchwardens of St Helen's and the Area Dean. The Team Clergy will work together to meet the parish's pastoral and liturgical needs. Meanwhile I encourage you to surround with your prayers the coming season of vacancy about which I shall say more in the forthcoming issue of the parish magazine: '*A Candle in the Window*'.

## **Worship**

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**October** Fr Paul will be celebrant and preacher on 27 October. Fr Paul will be celebrant at the All Souls' Day Mass on Saturday 2 November. Sunday 10 November is Remembrance Sunday, Fr AKMA will be celebrant and preacher at this Mass which, as usual, includes an Act of Remembrance at the end of the service.

*Week commencing 27 October.* Monday is the festival of Simon and Jude, apostles. Commemorations include Tuesday: James Hannington, bishop, martyr, 1885; Thursday: Martin Luther, reformer, 1546. Saturday is All Souls' Day.

*Week commencing 3 November.* The parish is following the calendar option of keeping All Saints' Day on Sunday 3 November. Commemorations during the week include Wednesday: Leonard, hermit, 6<sup>th</sup> century and William Temple, archbishop, teacher of the faith, 1944; Thursday: Willibrord, bishop, 739; Friday: Saints and Martyrs of England; Saturday: Margery Kempe, mystic, c. 1440.

**All Souls' Day** seems to have crept slowly into church calendars from the 7<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup> centuries. Many practices such as visiting cemeteries and decorating the graves of loved-ones with flower and candles have evolved over time. In the 15<sup>th</sup> century All Souls' College Oxford was founded with two purposes 1) The Warden and, originally, forty Fellows were to pray in chapel for the souls of the founders, of those who had fallen in the long wars with France, ...

and of 'all the faithful departed' and 2) the medieval equivalent of a modern graduate college. All Souls' Day was removed at the time of the Reformation but reappeared in the draft revised prayer book of 1927/28. It is thought that 'the matter of prayer for the departed was greatly influenced by the experience of the First World War.' Specific liturgies for All Souls' Day appeared in the *The Promise of His Glory*, a volume of services and prayers commended by the House of Bishops of General Synod, published in 1991, the basis for the current provisions in *Common Worship Times & Seasons* which we use in our Mass on this day.

In the East, the Greek Orthodox Church, for example, has a long tradition of praying for the departed on Saturdays (as do some western provisions), but doesn't have a specific "All Souls Day". Their calendar has a "Saturday of Souls" near the beginning of Lent and a second on the Saturday before Pentecost.

The passage below from a sermon by the late Austin Farrer, priest, philosophical theologian and former Warden of Keble College was first quoted in the pew leaflet in October 2021.

... our religion is not a simple relation of every soul separately to God, it is a mystical body in which we are all members one of another. And in this mystical body it does not suffice that every soul should be embraced by the thoughts of God; it has also to be that every soul should, in its thought, embrace the other souls. For apart from this mutual embracing, it would be unintelligible why we should pray at all, either for the living or the departed. Such prayer is nothing but the exercising of our membership in the body of Christ. God is not content to care for us each severally, unless he can also, by his Holy Spirit in each one of us, care through and in us for all the rest.

Every one of us is to be a focus of that divine life of which the attractive power holds the body together in one.

**William Temple** 1881 to 1944 was Archbishop of Canterbury from 1942 to 1963. Continuing the prayer for the departed theme, Temple wrote this in *Fellowship with God* (1920):

We do not pray for them because God will otherwise neglect them. We pray for them because we know he loves them and cares for them, and we can claim the privilege of uniting our love for them with God's.
