**We welcome The Revd Dr Jennifer Brown, Team Rector, to celebrate and preach at Mass today**

**Ash Wednesday** falls on Wednesday, **18 February**. There is no Mass at St Michael's that day, but there will be a celebration of Holy Communion with Imposition of Ashes at St Helen's Church at 10.30 am and a Parish Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes also at St Helen's Church at 7.30 pm.

It is possible that Lent may have followed Epiphany, reflecting the relationship between Jesus's baptism and his stay in the wilderness, though it became attached instead to Easter which became as the principal occasion for baptism. Lent was then a period of preparation for baptism in which the candidates were instructed in the Christian faith and the whole community joined with them in a period of study and repentance.

Common Worship, Times & Seasons, provides a good deal of material both Ash Wednesday, marking the start of Lent and for Lent itself. The basic structure of the Liturgy for Ash Wednesday is The Gathering, The Liturgy of the Word, The Liturgy of Penitence (including self-examination and confession, imposition of ashes, and absolution), The Liturgy of the Sacrament, and The Dismissal. I don't have a copy of the liturgy as it will be used in the parish on Wednesday evening, so the elements below are taken from the liturgy used in the parish at St Michael's last year.

At the start of the service, the celebrant explained the meaning of Lent in these words:

Brothers and sisters in Christ, since early days Christians have observed with great devotion the time of our Lord's passion and resurrection and prepared for this by a season of penitence and fasting.

At first this season of Lent was observed by those who were preparing for Baptism at Easter and by those who were to be restored to the Church's fellowship from which they had been separated through sin. In course of time the Church came to recognise that, by a careful keeping of these days, all Christians might take to heart the call to repentance and the assurance of forgiveness proclaimed in the Gospel, and so to grow in faith and in devotion to our Lord.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy word.

The Liturgy of the Word was followed by The Liturgy of Penitence, using a form of self-examination and confession in the form of a litany. A few of the petitions from this are included below

...

From all evil and mischief; from pride, vanity and hypocrisy; from envy, hatred, and malice; from all evil intent, **good Lord, deliver us.**

From sloth, worldliness, and love of money; from hardness of heart and contempt for your word and your laws, **good Lord, deliver us.**

...

By the mystery of your holy incarnation; by your birth, childhood, and obedience; by your baptism, fasting, and temptation, **good Lord, deliver us.**

By your ministry in word and work; by your mighty acts of power; and by your preaching of the kingdom, **good Lord, deliver us.**

...

Give us true repentance; forgive us our sins of negligence and ignorance and our deliberate sins; and grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit to amend our lives according to your holy word.

**Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.**

After a period of silence, all prayed a form of confession. This was then followed by the Imposition of Ashes introduced with this prayer by the celebrant:

Dear friends in Christ,

I invite you to receive these ashes as a sign of the spirit of penitence with which we shall keep this season of Lent.

God our Father, you create us from the dust of the earth: grant that these ashes may be for us a sign of our penitence and a symbol of our mortality; for it is by your grace alone that we receive eternal life in Jesus Christ our Saviour.

The Imposition of Ashes is accompanied by the following words:

Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return. Repent and believe the Gospel.

After which the celebrant pronounced a form of absolution. Mass then continued as usual. The extended preface to the Eucharistic Prayer is included in the Worship section below.

As part of the consultation process, the Diocese is arranging an online open meeting at which they can hear views from any member of the diocese who would like to attend. This will be on 19 March at 6pm on Zoom. Registration is essential. This meeting is open to anyone who lives or works in Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire, and Berkshire. **Abingdon Foodbank** At present the foodbank is currently asking for noodles, UHT milk, fruit juice, tinned fruit, squash, corned beef, meatballs, sweetcorn and cooking oil. Deodorants for men and women also needed as are carrier bags. In December 2025, Abingdon Foodbank distributed 272 standard emergency food parcels to people facing hardship in Abingdon and the surrounding villages. These parcels fed 731 people, of which 272 were children. The 2025 Christmas hamper campaign saw special Christmas parcels distributed to 388 local families. We worked with schools and local agencies to help us identify people in need, and thanks to your wonderful donations we helped feed 1,233 people, of which, 644 were children.

There is a collection point in church and other points are situated in local supermarkets and some other local businesses. **February** Celebrants and preachers are: 15 and 22 February, The Revd Dr Jennifer Brown.

Ash Wednesday falls on 18 February this year. There is one commemoration this week: Tuesday: Janani Luwum, archbishop, martyr, 1977.

**Ash Wednesday and Lent** During Lent Eucharistic Prayer E is used, the Kyries is used in place of the Gloria. “Alleluia” is not said during Lent so *Christ to you O Christ, King of Eternal Glory* is used at the start and end of the acclamation before the gospel reading. The *extended Preface for the Eucharistic Prayer* used from Ash Wednesday until the Saturday after the Fourth Sunday of Lent (the eve of Passion Sunday):

It is indeed right and good to give you thanks and praise, almighty God and everlasting Father, through Jesus Christ your Son.

For in these forty days you lead us into the desert of repentance that through a pilgrimage of prayer and discipline we may grow in grace and learn to be your people once again.

Through fasting, prayer and acts of service you bring us back to your generous heart.

Through study of your holy word you open our eyes to your presence in the world and free our hands to welcome others into the radiant splendour of your love.

As we prepare to celebrate the Easter feast with joyful hearts and minds we bless you for your mercy and join with saints and angels for ever praising you and saying: Holy, ...

**Archbishop of Westminster** On 19 December last year, the announcement of Cardinal Vincent Nichols’ retirement was made, and at the same time Pope Leo announced the appointment of Bishop Richard Moth as the next Archbishop of Westminster. ### **Collect (Ash Wednesday)**

Almighty and everlasting God, you hate nothing that you have made and forgive the sins of all those who are penitent: create and make in us new and contrite hearts that we, worthily lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness, may receive from you, the God of all mercy, perfect remission and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, ...

### **Prayer after Communion (Ash Wednesday)**

Almighty God, you have given your only Son to be for us both a sacrifice for sin and also an example of godly life: give us grace that we may always most thankfully receive these his inestimable gifts, and also daily endeavour to follow the blessed steps of his most holy life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
